Intergroup Dialogue (IGD) - What is it? How can it be used in Mediation?

Intergroup dialogues are dialogues between two or more social identity groups, specifically identities which represent historical, power, and/or structural inequalities.

IGD aims to bring together individuals from two or more social identity groups that sometimes have had contentious relationships with each other, or at the very least have lacked opportunities to talk in non-superficial ways.

The goals of IGD are to give participants the skills to engage in dialogue in a diverse society, develop awareness of their own identities in the context of systems of privilege and inequality, and explore the similarities and differences in experiences within and across social group membership.

This brown bag will explore how IGD dialogue can be used in other conflict resolution situations to help mediators and others work with differences, disagreements, and conflicts as opportunities for deeper understanding.
