To enhance faculty sensitivity to a diverse student body and classroom setting and encourage development of diverse instruction techniques and applications

Reward amount:

\$50.00 toward faculty registration or fees to any faculty-based diversity event

Grant Description & Provisions:

Description

Each year IUN anticipates opportunities to enhance its general classroom environment and faculty-student relationship by assisting faculty with the awareness and development of course delivery skills and appropriate cultural references in the classroom. The Office of Diversity & Equity serves as a catalyst for resources and supports those who chose to further their delivery skills and sensitivity to our student body and minority colleagues with whom they work. The FPD Grant is designed to encourage a faculty initiative on the IUN campus for proactive approaches to a rapidly changing student body and faculty responsibility for instruction across cultural and ethnic barriers. Participants are selected based upon merit of development initiative and a brief statement depicting how information acquired is intended to be put to practical use in the classroom and in relationships with minority colleagues.

Provisions

Who can participate?

- All IUN faculty personnel

What must I do to get the grant?

Submit:

- Name and department where you intend to use new pedagogy techniques
- Information about the event to be attended for development purposes
- Brief statement explaining how information acquired will be put to practical use in the classroom and in cross-cultural peer relationships

What are the deadlines?

- FPD grants must be used during the current semester

How to apply?

- Submit the required information to Yasmin Fontanez in the ODE, Marram Hall 118 at least one month prior to expected attendance to your event

How will I know if I receive the grant?

- Grant applicants will be notified of an approval decision by the Director of the ODE
