#### WORK IN PROGRESS

**Project Initiation Grant, "Student Victimization Survey,"** with Monica Solinas-Saunders. This survey covers 50 IUN courses and, in Spring 2014, was distributed to the IUN student body with the help of student research assistants. Objectives are to discover the prevalence and types of victimization among our students, share results with the administration, and use the resulting data to apply for external funding that will address our students' issues. Our goal is to learn about services the university can provide to better equip students to cope with their lives and succeed academically. The analyzed results of the survey will be submitted to *Journal of Family Violence* or *Journal of Interpersonal Violence*. **Status: Received partial funding (\$5,000).**
